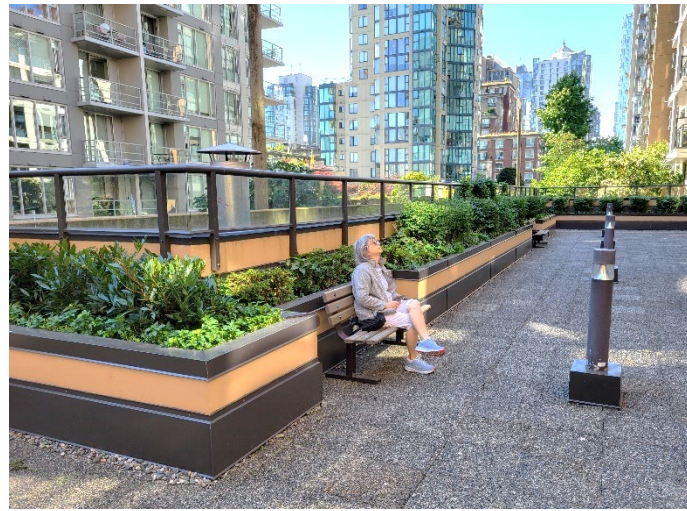


## ROBINSON TOWER LANDSCAPE, Vancouver, BC

Robinson Tower, a 17-storey condominium in Vancouver's Yaletown neighbourhood, required extensive renovations to replace the building's cladding and the waterproof membrane of the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor patio, which had failed after 25 years. As a consultant to the strata council and in close coordination with Morrison Hershfield (now Stantec), engineers on the project, Erik Mustonen provided an updated landscape design, obtained necessary approvals from the City of Vancouver, and conducted construction administration for the project. This included the 2<sup>nd</sup> storey patio and street tree planting, along Richards and Helmcken Streets. The plant list was updated to eliminate invasive species that had been used in the 1993 design and select species appropriate for the region.
